In addition to NETS, DIISR funding in support of the Network operations during 2011-2013, funding has been sought from the Universities, ANSTO, CSIRO and DSTO. Response of the Universities has been extremely positive with a funding commitment of \$140K per year to date. We are grateful to DIISR and the Universities for their support to the Network.

Currently the Network has more than 1400 members and 250 research groups are participating in the Network. We are keen to expand the membership of the Network and in particular would look to expand to include industry members. 

National Enabling Technologies Strategy (NETS)

Under the NETS a Stakeholder Advisory Council (SAC) of 13 individuals representing industry, research, non-government organisations, the social sciences and government was established on 4 November 2010 and had it's first meeting on 28 January 2011 . An Expert Forum of eight people has also been established to guide the Strategy's technology foresighting activities and to identify challenges and opportunities arising in the next 5 to 10 years from the new enabling technologies and has met twice. Under the Expert Forum the NETS team is developing a program of industry foresight workshops targeting different industry sectors where new enabling technologies show potential for industry uptake and making a contribution to Australia's major national challenges. The first workshop was targeted at the building products industry and was conducted in collaboration with the Built Environment Industry Innovation Council. The NETS has also commissioned 10 case studies that showcase the use of nanotechnology in various organisations in the context of solving industry problems as well producing the 3rd Edition of the Nanotechnology Capabilities Report. The Report provides information on and enables connection between: private firms, research institutions, infrastructure bodies and Australian government agencies involved in nanotechnology.
